# HISTORY

We, the Class of 1942, stepped upon the deck of the big steamer, High School, in 1938. Just a few more years, and our voyage would be only a glimmer of history.

The time, which climaxed all else was the night of May 1, 1942, when twelve happy seniors were given diplomas as full-fledged seamen and stepped from the deck of High School upon the platform of life to take their places in the world.

Annie Jane Causey and Lucille Norman were married yesterday in a double ceremony.

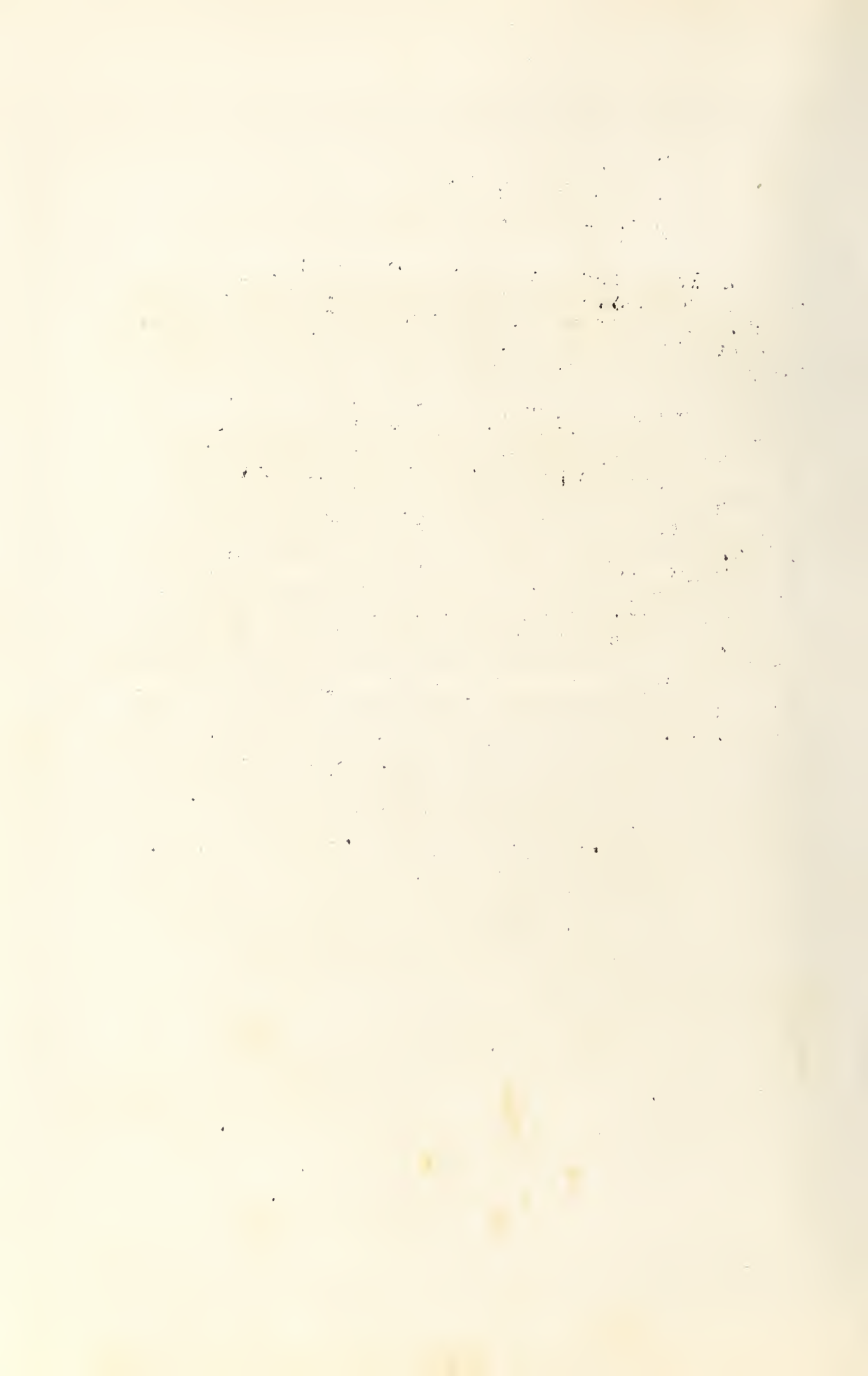



## Friends and Classmates:

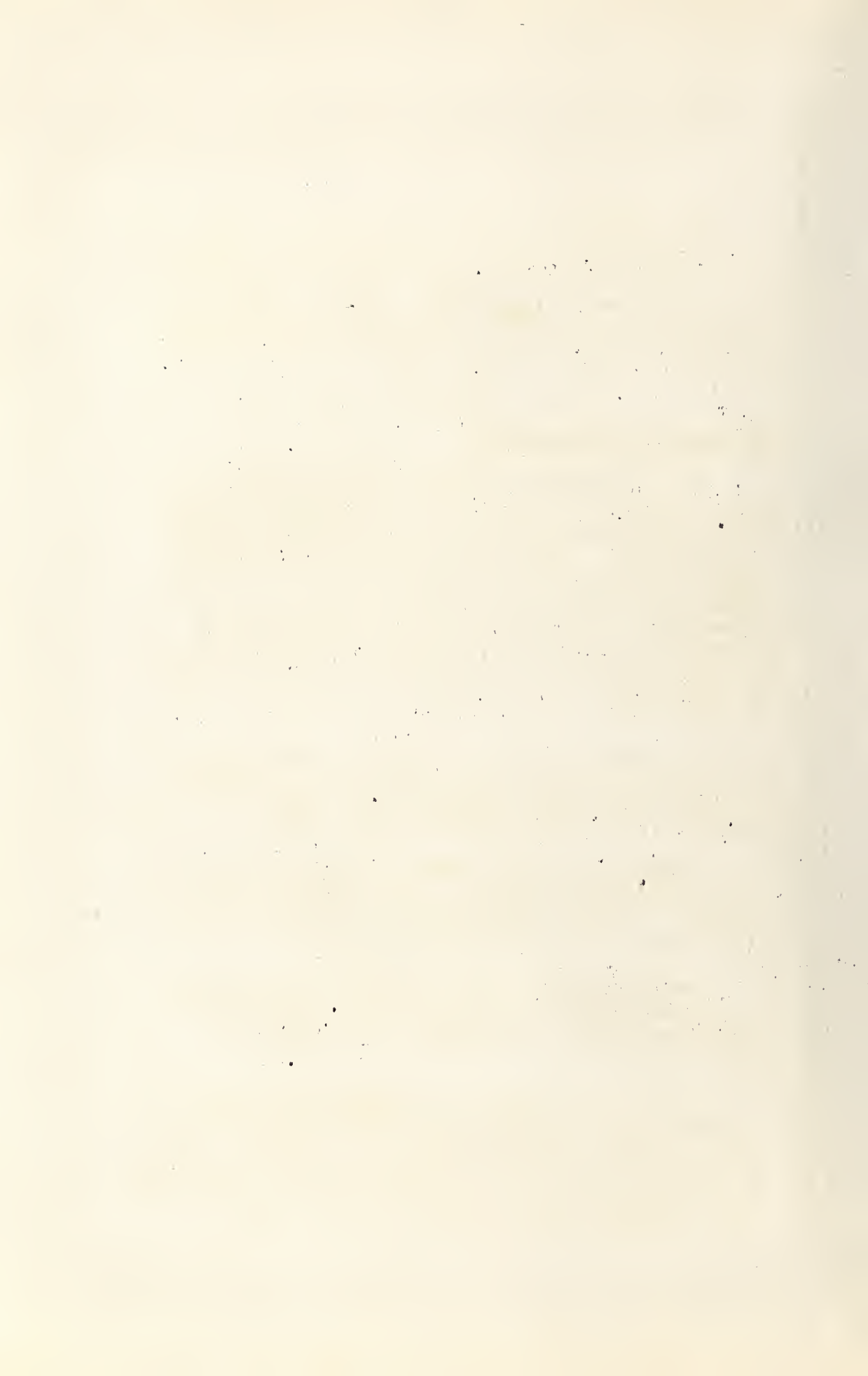

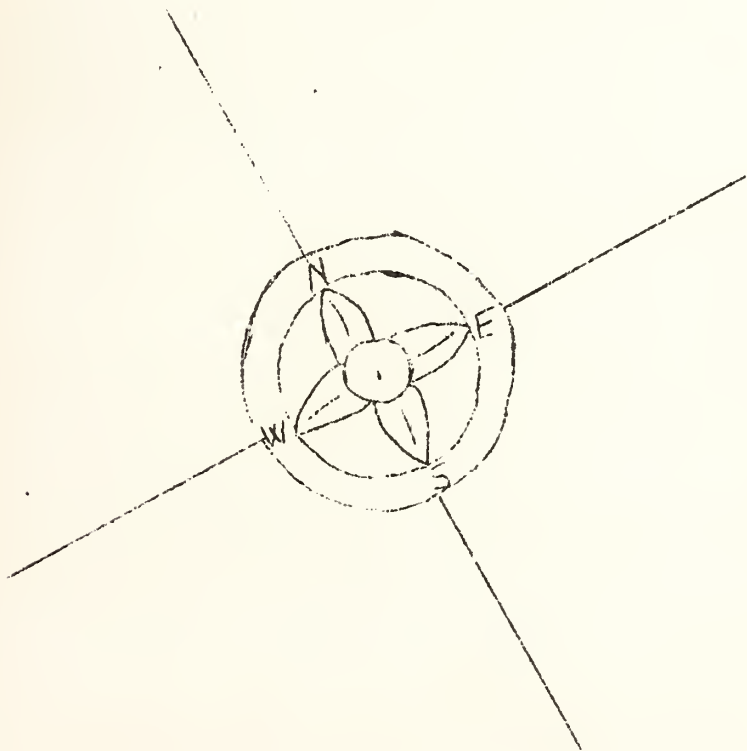


We shall soon take our separate ways, but we shall not be separated in spirit. In memory we shall always be one loyal class.
